APPENDIX B

Non-Exhaustive Selection of Ewing Township Ordinances

§ 39: 4-135 Improper Parking

Parking; direction and side of street; angle parking; one-way street

The operator of a vehicle shall not stop, stand or park the vehicle in a roadway other than parallel with the edge of the roadway headed in the direction of traffic, on the right-hand side of the road and with the curb side of the vehicle within six inches of the edge of the roadway except as follows:

- a. Upon those streets which have been designated by ordinance and have been marked or signed for angle parking, vehicles shall be parked at the angel to the curb designated and indicated by the ordinance and marks or signs.
- b. Upon one-way streets, local authorities may permit parking of vehicles parallel with the left-hand edge of the roadway headed in the direction of traffic, on the left-hand side of the road and with the curb side of the vehicle within six inches of the edge of the roadway.

§ 91-9A Alcoholic Beverages

91-9A.1 Underage Persons, Possession or Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages on Private Property. It shall be unlawful for any person under the legal age who, without legal authority knowingly possesses or knowingly consumes an alcoholic beverage on private property.

91-9A.2 Exceptions.

- a. It shall not be illegal for such under-aged person to consume or possess an alcoholic beverage in connection with a religious observance, ceremony, or rite: or consume or possess an alcoholic beverage in the presence of/and with the permission of a parent, guardian or relative who has attained the legal age to purchase and consume alcoholic beverages.
- b. It shall not be illegal for such under-aged person to consume or possess an alcoholic beverage while actually engaged in the performance of employment by a person who is licensed under title 33 of the revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey: or while actually engaged in the preparation of food while enrolled in a culinary arts or hotel management program at a county vocational school or post secondary educational institution; except that this Ordinance shall not be Seq., as amended from time to time, or any other law, against a person who is convicted of unlawful alcoholic beverage activity on or at premises licensed for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

91-9A.3 Penalty.

There shall be a fine of \$250.00 for a first offense; and a \$300.00 for any subsequent offense.

In addition, the Court in its discretion, may suspend or postpone for six months the driving privilege of the Defendant. Upon conviction of any person and the suspension or postponement of that persons drivers license, the Court shall forward a report to the Division of Motor Vehicles stating the first and last day of the suspension or postponement period imposed by the Court. If a person at the time of the imposition of a sentence is less than 17 years of age, the period of license postponement, including a suspension or postponement of the privilege of operating a motorized bicycle, shall commence on the day the sentence is imposed and shall run for a period of six month after the person reaches the age of 17 years.

If at the time of imposition of sentence the person has a valid New Jersey drivers license the court shall immediately collect the license and forward it to the Division of Motor Vehicles along with the foresaid report. If for any reason the license cannot be collected, the Court shall include in the report the complete name, address, date of birth, eye color, and sex of the person, as well as the first and last date of the license suspension period imposed by the Court.

The Court shall inform the person orally and in writing that if the person is convicted of operating a motor vehicle during the period of license suspension or postponement, the person shall be subject to the penalties set forth in N.J.S.A. 39:3-40, et seq., as amended from time to time. The person shall be required to acknowledge receipt of the written notice in writing. Failure to receive a written notice or failure to so acknowledge in writing the receipt shall not be a defense to a subsequent charge of a violation of N.J.S.A. 39:3-40, et.seq.

If a person convicted under the Ordinance is not a New Jersey resident, the Court shall suspend or postpone, as appropriate, the non-resident driving privilege of the person based on the age of the person and submit to the Division of Motor Vehicles, the required report. The Court shall not collect the license of a non-resident convicted under this Ordinance. Upon receipt of a report from this Court, New Jersey Statue directs the Division of Motor Vehicles to notify the appropriate officials in the licensing jurisdiction of the suspension or postponement.

§257-11 Urinating in public, prohibited

No person shall urinate or place any bodily waste of humans on any public street, sidewalk or other place in public view, or to which the public is invited or has access, except in a lavatory toilet or similar facility.

§257-3 Deface/Graffiti

To cover, mark, write on, paint, color or otherwise mark, disfigure or draw on any private or public property anything of any nature whatsoever without the express consent of the owner.

§ 124-2 Open Burning

No person shall burn or permit to be burned papers or other matter on any public street or any other open area, public or private, located within the Township, except in an approved Fire Container.

§ 141-6 Vehicles and tires.

- A. All vehicles shall be covered when necessary to prevent loads or residue from dropping, sifting, leaking, blowing out or otherwise escaping into the environment.
- B. No vehicles of any kind whatsoever shall be parked on any residential lawn.
- C. Tires may not be stored in the township except in a fully enclosed structure or building.

§ 224 Littering

224-1 Prohibited Acts.

It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to place upon, deliver, deposit, drop upon, throw upon, leave or abandon within or upon any public or private property any garbage, cans, bottles, cartons and any other type of refuse whatsoever, or any handbills, advertisements, brochures, flyers, shoppers, samples or other unsolicited commercial matter, printed or otherwise, of every kind or nature whatsoever.

224-3 Obstruction, nuisance and litter on sidewalks and other areas.

It shall be illegal for any person owning, occupying, leasing, managing or having responsibility over any lands within the township to cause, permit or suffer any obstruction, nuisance or litter as defined in §141-1 on any sidewalk, front, side or rear yard, alleyway or other area on said lands. Responsibility under this section shall extend to 18 inches into any abutting street.

224-4 Responsibilities of owner or occupier of lands.

- A. No person shall sweep or deposit into or onto any gutter, street, catch basin or other public area any litter as defined above or leaves and other similar debris from any source whatsoever.
- B. All person owning, occupying, leasing, managing or having responsibility over any lands within the township shall keep the sidewalks free of litter as defined above and shall keep all sweepings in containers until collection.
- C. Within 30 minutes of opening for business, all retail, commercial, industrial and professional establishments shall clean all litter off their premises and up to 18 inches into the street.
- D. All garbage will be placed in containers, not paper or plastic bags left outside the residence.

§ 407-3 Noise

Any matter, thing, condition, or act which is deemed to be injurious, detrimental or menace to the public health or environment is deemed to be an annoyance or interfere with the comfort or wellbeing of the inhabitants of the Township is declared to be a nuisance/noise.

407-3a. Examples of Noise. Examples of noise include but are not limited to the following:

- a. Yelling, screaming, slamming of vehicle doors,
- b. The operation, between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., of device which interferes with the comfort of others.
- c. The operation of a radio, phonograph, loudspeaker, sound amplifier or other device upon the public street for the purpose of commercial advertising or attracting the attention of the public.
